Overview of the CCO Community Advisory Council

According to ORS 414.625, Coordinated Care Organizations (CCO) must have a Community Advisory Council (CAC) which makes recommendations to the CCO Governing Board in order to ensure that health care needs of the consumers and community are being addressed.

The CAC must:

- Include representatives of the community;
- Have consumer representatives constitute a majority of the membership;
- Meet no less frequently than once every 3 months; and
- Have its membership selected by a committee composed of equal numbers of county representatives and members of the governing body of the organization.

CAC Member Roles and Responsibilities

The duties of the CCO Community Advisory Council include:

- Identifying and advocating for preventive care practices to be utilized by the organization;
- Developing a community wellness program; and
- Annually publishing a report on the health of the organization that includes a review of the work of the organization and recommendations to the governing body of the organization for change improvements.

Other requirements:

- Members should be willing to commit to an estimated **2 year term limit**.
- Members of the Trillium CCO-CAC serve renewable terms at the discretion of the Trillium CCO Governance Board.
- Members should plan to attend CAC meetings on the 4th Monday of every month from 12-2 p.m.

Rural Community Advisory Council

In addition to the Community Advisory Council, a Rural Community Advisory Council has been established to ensure that the health care needs of the rural consumers and community are being addressed. The Rural Advisory Council works collaboratively with the Community Advisory Council and the Governing Board to transform the health care delivery system in rural parts of Lane County as well as ensure that the care provided in the urban area is responsive to the needs of rural residents.
